Cutting Instructions

Basic White Cardstock

4" x 5-1/4" inside panel

Night of Navy Cardstock

5-1/2" x 8-1/2" scored at 4-1/4" 5" x 4-1/2" – cut 2 large elongated dies

Basic Black Cardstock

3-3/4" x 2" scrap for plane back

Copper Clay Cardstock

4-1/4" x 2" for wings and details

Silver 12" x 12" Foil Sheets

3-3/4" x 2" plane body & propellers

Take to the Sky 12" x 12" Designer Series Paper

2" x 4" for focal point front 2" x 5-1/4" – 1 each of 2 patterns 2-1/4" x 6 – envelope flap 1-1/4" x 1-7/8" – light colored DSP for sentiment banner 1-1/2" x 2" – banner under sentiment

Instructions

- 1. Score, fold and burnish card base.
- 2. Die cut the following using the Mini Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine:
 - a. Plane body 2 pcs (Silver and Basic Black)
 - b. Propellers Silver
 - c. Wings and plane details Copper Clay
 - d. 2nd largest elongated Nested Essentials Die 2 pcs Night of Navy
 - e. 2nd smallest elongated Nested Essentials Die DSP
- 3. Cut 2" off the front of the card base.
- 4. Score the 2" x 5-1/2" cardstock in half at 2-3/4" and fold at the score line.
- 5. Adhere the flap to the card base centering the flap and lining the folded edge up even with the edge of the card base.
- 6. Attach the inside panel to the card base, covering the bottom of the flap.
- 7. Adhere DSP pattern 1 cut at 2" x 5-1/4" to the right side of the Basic White Cardstock panel with adhesive.
- 8. Adhere DSP pattern 2 cut at 2" x 5-1/4" to the front of the card base.
- 9. Adhere the 2 elongated Night of Navy Cardstock die cuts to either side of the front flap matching the die cut edges and centering the die cut on the edge of the front panel.
- 10. Adhere the DSP elongated die cut to the front of the focal point with adhesive.
- 11. Remove the silver wheels from the plane body with paper snips and adhere the black plane body to the silver body with adhesive (Seal is recommended as the glue seeps through the plane details).
- 12. Adhere the wings and plane detail to the plane body with Seal.
- 13. Adhere the propellers to the front of the card with Seal.
- 14. Close the card and determine the desired location for the plane. Adhere to the front with Seal or Stampin' Dimensionals.
- 15. Adhere three industrial trinkets to the card with liquid glue.
- 16. Stamp the sentiment on light colored DSP and trim the banner tails with paper snips (snip up the center, then to the top of the center snip from either side.)
- 17. Align the smaller DSP on the wider DSP and, using the already snipped banner as a guide, snip and second banner.
- 18. Adhere the banners to each other with adhesive.
- 19. Adhere the banners to the card panel with adhesive.
- 20. Adhere the 2-1/4" x 6" DSP to the envelope flap and trim with paper snips.
- 21. Stamp the riveted metal stamp using Night of Navy ink stamped off twice on the front of the envelope.
- 22. Tag me at #stampwithnel when you make this card. I would love to see your creation
